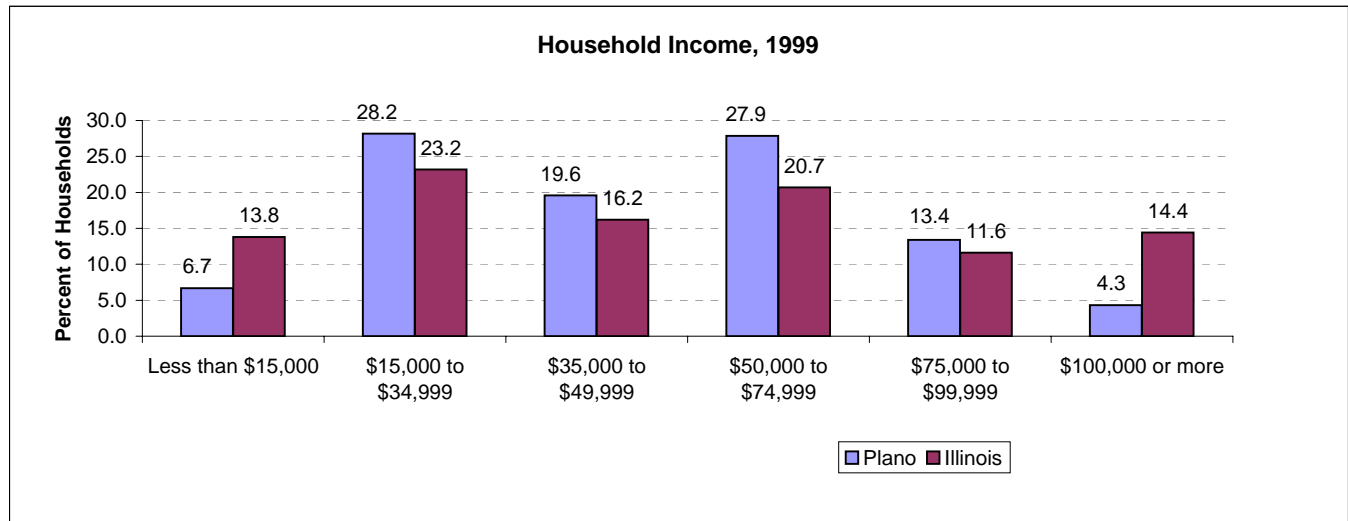

Quick Facts

- The 2000 population stands at 5,633. This has increased since 1990 by 10.4%.
- People in the 65 years or older category represent 9.5% of the total population, while the 0-17 age category represents 31.4% of the population in 2000
- According to the 2000 Census, persons of the Hispanic or Latino origin represent 25.8% of the population, while 12.3% of the total population is of Hispanic or Latino origin in the state of Illinois.
- The total number of households increased by 6.6% between 1990 and 2000. There were 1,901 households in 2000
- The number of female-headed households with children under 18 has increased by 17.5% between 1990 and 2000.
- The proportion of individuals that have at least a high school education has increased between 1990 and 2000, from 70.7% to 75.4%. The proportion of individuals with a Bachelor's Degree or better has increased from 10.1% to 10.2%, during that same time period.
- In 2000, 32.9% of employment was in manufacturing while 28.8% was in the service sector, while the State of Illinois had 16.0% employed in manufacturing and 49.3% employed in the service sector.
- The median household income was \$46,526 in 1999 (2000 Census), while median household income for the state of Illinois was \$46,590.
- 5.4% of the population was below the poverty level of income in 2000. The state's comparable figure was 10.7%.
- The proportion of elderly in poverty declined between 1990 and 2000, from 15.5% to 5.7%
- The proportion of youth (age 0 - 17) in poverty has declined between 1990 and 2000, from 10.1% to 8.1%
